
NEW FRANCE ANCESTRAL LOCATIONS 17th CENTURY

New France, Circa 1663



2 Population census for New France were completed during the 17th Century. The first was in 1666/1667 and the second was completed in 1681. These census provide a snapshot into the lives of our ancestors that goes beyond the birth, marriage and death records that are required to verify and document ancestry.

The 1681 census data includes the location, head of household surname and age, the wife's surname (it was customary for women to keep their birth surname) and age, the children's names and ages. Also included was the number of rifles ("fusil") within the household, the number of cattle ("bêtes à corn") and other domesticated farm animals. The number of arpents (similar in size to an acre) under cultivation ("arpents en valeur") was also recorded by household.

It is well documented that there were lots of spelling variations for surnames and the recorded ages were not always accurate.








MARIE BLANCHARD My 9th Great Grandmother

There is **no 1666/1667 census record** for **Marie Blanchard** (a Fille du Roi) and Mathieu Brunet even though their wedding took place at Notre Dame, Quebec City on October 11, 1667. By 1681 Marie and Mathieu had 7 children around their table, 1 milking cow and 21 arpents under cultivation!

Location Map for Marie Chevreau & Rene Reaume 1667 and 1681 (14) and (15)



Marie Chevreau (a Fille du Roi) married Rene Reaume in 1665. By 1667 the couple has cleared some land and built a house. The 1681 census finds them at the same location with the first 8 of their 13 children, a rifle, a cow and 10 arpents under cultivation. In addition to clearing land and farming, Rene was also a master carpenter.

FRANCOISE HURTEAU My 9th Great Grandmother

There is no 1667 census data for **Francoise Hurteau** as she was born in France in 1666. She became an orphan shortly after her birth. She came to New France in 1680 at the age of 14, as an engaged (contracted) servant to Jacques Peillereau.


1681 Census transcript (16)

"Francoise, servant, 15" is my 9th Great Grandmother, Francoise Hurteau. Her wedding to Antoine Monet in 1684, lists the following witnesses:

Jacques Peillereau (her employer); Urbain Boudereau (Baudrot) and his wife Mathurine Juillet; Catherine and Jeanne Perthuis -are found on the previous page of the census, they were living with their father Pierre Perthuis, a Montreal Merchant. Both Pierre Perthuis & Jacques Peillereau were soldiers with the Carignan Saliere Regiment, and they were both originally from Amboise, France the same town as Francoise! It is very unlikely that this is just a coincidence!
